FOOD WASTE IS 30% OF LANDFILL

Food waste disposers are a solution.

How to use ...

- Start running cold water
- Turn on disposal
- Gradually put in food waste
- Let disposal grind waste
- Turn off disposal
- Let cold water run briefly
- **NEVER** pour grease into disposal

Racine Wastewater Treatment Plant creates methane to power the facility and bio-solids for fertilizer.

Learn how to compost

WHAT TO AVOID

Plastic bags:

- Use renewable cloth bags

Styrofoam at restaurants:

- BYO containers for leftovers

Plastic water bottles:

- Use metal/reusable bottle

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- 1. Do recycled items in bins end up in landfill?**
Absolutely not. They are taken to John's Disposal (Franksville), sorted, and sold. See the video:

Put in clear plastic bag, seal, and place in your blue recycling bin.

1. Because waste is a global problem
2. Saves energy
3. Protects our oceans and waterways
4. Provides resources for new products
5. Prolongs the life of landfills
6. It's Wisconsin law!

PAPER YES

- All cardboard (**flatten boxes**)
- Cereal & food boxes, soda & beer cases
- Newsprint and newspaper inserts
- Magazines and catalogues, including glossy catalogs
- Paperback books
- Phonebooks
- Regular books and textbooks (**remove hard covers**)
- Office computer paper
- Notebook paper (**remove spiral binder**)
- Brown paper bags
- Junk mail and envelopes
- Gift wrapping
- Clean paper cups for hot and cold (remove lids, **not if wax coated**)
- Clean paper plates (scrape off food, **not if soggy**)
- Pizza and other food boxes (scrape off food, **not if grease-stained**)
- Paper milk cartons (**remove lids**)
- Paper egg cartons (**not styrofoam**)

NO!

- Metal clips or spiral binders
- Food contaminated containers
- Plastic cards • Tissue paper
- Books with hard cover
- Tissues or paper towels
- Stick-on labels
- Unused stamps



GLASS YES

- Beverage containers (**clean and rinse, remove lids**)
- Food containers (**clean and rinse, remove lids**)
- Drinking glasses
- Glass containers such as Mason and candle jars
- Clear glass
- Brown glass
- Green glass

NO!

- Window glass • Mirror glass
- Ceramics • Light bulbs
- Fluorescent or LED lamps
- Hazardous material
- Liquids or foods in containers (**RINSE CONTAINERS THOROUGHLY**)

NO PLASTIC BAGS!



STEEL CANS & ALUMINIUM YES

- Clean aluminum cans (no need to crush)
- Clean tin cans (no need to crush)
- Clean steel food and beverage containers
- Aluminum trays (**remove food**)
- Aluminum foil (**remove food and crumple into a ball**)
- Empty aerosol cans (**must be empty or will cause fire**)

NO!

- Food or liquid left in containers (**RINSE CONTAINERS THOROUGHLY**)
- Car parts or scrap metal
- Hazardous material
- Batteries of any kind
- Paint products



PLASTIC YES

- Clear and colored plastic
- #s 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7
- Any plastic bottles with screw on caps
- Plastic containers and bottles (**even if no number is on them**)
- Plastic milk cartons
- Plastic juice bottles and jugs
- Soda/water/beverage bottles
- Frozen dessert cups
- Butter and margarine tubs
- Yogurt cups and containers (**remove residue**)
- Syrup and ketchup bottles (**clean thoroughly**)
- Narrow neck grocery item bottles
- Push top squirt bottles
- Detergent containers
- Fabric softener containers
- Health and beauty bottles
- Household cleaner containers
- Kitty litter plastic buckets

NO!

- Styrofoam / Polystyrene
- Leftover liquids (**RINSE ALL BOTTLES THOROUGHLY**)
