
SOUP-er Bowl of Caring is back!

- Cereal & food boxes, soda & beer cases All cardboard (flatten boxes)
- Newsprint and newspaper inserts Magazines and catalogues,
 - including glossy catalogs
- Paperback books
- Phonebooks
- Regular books and textbooks
 - (remove hard covers)
- Notebook paper (remove spiral binder) Office computer paper
- Brown paper bags
- Junk mail and envelopes
- Gift wrapping
- Clean paper cups for hot and cold remove lids, not if wax coated)
- (scrape off food, not if soggy) Pizza and other food boxes Clean paper plates
- (scrape off food, not if grease-stained) Paper milk cartons (remove lids)
 - Paper egg cartons (not styrofoam)

- Metal clips or spiral binders
- Food contaminated containers Plastic cards • Tissue paper
- Tissues or paper towels Books with hard cover
- Stick-on labels
