

At this time, the team still needs assistance with transportation, educational support, cultural awareness, babysitting, employment support, and monthly fun events.

SITUATION REPORT:

CRISIS IN UKRAINE

March 25, 2022 | No. 3



SITUATION OVERVIEW

Conflict in Ukraine has put millions of people in danger. As Ukrainians shelter from bomb blasts or flee their homes, many need medical attention, food, water, and basic sanitation. Civilians have been injured or killed in eastern Ukraine, the capital Kyiv, and other areas. People are sheltering underground to escape shelling from heavy artillery, rockets and airstrikes. In the combat zones, thousands of families have been cut off from water, food, electricity and fuel for days. Health facilities have sustained damage and many Ukrainians are in need of medical attention.

The United Nations Refugee Agency (UNHCR) estimates that more than 3.6 million people have fled to neighboring countries, while approximately 6.5 million have been displaced within Ukraine in winter temperatures. The Polish government has passed legislation to support Ukrainian refugees in Poland, which allows them to access basic services such as healthcare, education and the right to work. The flood of refugees is putting pressure on food and other supplies in host communities.

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF RESPONSE

We have committed \$4 million to respond to this crisis, and we expect to increase this amount as we secure additional funding.

Our Humanitarian Action team is working with partners to rapidly develop and implement programming based on short and long-term needs. We are deploying additional technical staff to support our relief operations in Poland, including a team leader and a health advisor to assess and explore additional health needs among refugee populations. We are also working to expand our humanitarian assistance to reach heavily affected communities and populations in Ukraine.

Our initial response includes:

- Emergency cash and vouchers for Ukrainian refugees in Poland. We've committed \$2 million to this effort in a combined program with Lutheran World Federation (LWF).
- Support for protection services for refugee women and children who are facing sexual exploitation and abuse.
- Ongoing support for the Lutheran Church of St. Martin in Krakow, Poland, which has established a hostel for Ukrainian women and children. We have provided essential supplies including milk, energy biscuits, personal hygiene products and room partition panels.
 We will continue to support the church to expand its relief operations in coordination with LWF.
- Shipping and distributing LWR Quilts and Care Kits in partnership with local organizations.

We are coordinating with local organizations to move essential supplies into Ukraine, including medical supplies.

We are grateful for the thousands of Lutherans across the United States whose care and generosity have made it possible for us to respond immediately. At this time, financial gifts are the number one need to assist refugees on the move.
