A READING FROM GENESIS 37, 39, 41, 42 & 50(CEV, selected verses)

In Genesis chapter 12, which we read last week, God promised Abraham many descendants. Abraham's son Isaac had a son named Jacob, who was later renamed "Israel". Jacob had 12 sons. This is the story of those brothers, especially Joseph.

Jacob loved Joseph more than he did any of his other sons, and so Joseph's brothers hated him and would not be friendly to him. [One day] the brothers saw Joseph coming and made plans to kill him. [One of the brothers] tried to protect Joseph from them. [So, instead] they threw Joseph into a dry well. A little while later, they sold Joseph to slave traders who took him to Egypt. [Meanwhile] the traders took Joseph to Egypt and sold him to Potiphar, the king's official in charge of the palace guard. Soon Potiphar realized that the LORD was helping Joseph to be successful in whatever he did. Potiphar liked Joseph and made him his personal assistant, putting him in charge of his house and all of his property. Because of Joseph, the LORD began to bless Potiphar's family and fields. Potiphar's wife soon noticed Joseph, and said, "Lie with me.", but he refused and said, "I won't sin against God by doing such a terrible thing as this." [So the Master's wife tricked Joseph, and lied to her husband, and Potiphar was convinced that his servant had betrayed him.] Potiphar became very angry and threw Joseph in prison. While Joseph was in prison, the LORD helped him and was good to him. He even made the jailer like Joseph so much that he put him in charge of the other prisoners and of everything that was done in the jail. The LORD was with Joseph and made him successful in all that he did. [After many years, Joseph was removed from prison and became an advisor to the king] The king told Joseph, "God is the one who has shown you these things. You are now governor of all Egypt!" [Eventually, a famine came over the entire region, but Egypt had enough grain stored because of Joseph's leadership.] People from all over the world came to Egypt to buy grain, because the famine was so severe in their countries, including Joseph's brothers. They did not recognize Joseph, but at once he knew who they were. [After many more interactions, Joseph's brothers, Jacob's other sons, came to Jacob and said] Now we ask you to please forgive the terrible things we did. After all, we serve the same God that your father worshiped. When Joseph heard this, he started crying, [and said] "you intended to harm me, but God intended it for good, in order to bring it


about as it is this day, to save many lives". After Joseph said this, his brothers felt much better. [Jacob and his family came to Egypt, and lived under Joseph's protection for the rest of their lives.]
