We are also planning a welcome celebration for the Anderson family on October 1st. Please mark your calendar, more details will be coming out soon.



SUNDAY'S SERMON AND "GOSPEL TALK"

We've been talking about God's politics that came into the world preeminently through Jesus. This week's Gospel Reading from Matthew 18 brings us to the matter of forgiveness. Central to God's politics for this broken world is forgiveness. It is my firm belief that we have not seen God's politics carried out in history as a mass movement until Mahatma Gandhi in the 20th century. Since then, his way of Satyagraha, "Soul Force," has become a permanent fixture in human politics, adopted to many situations – in our own country, in the Civil Rights and Black Lives Matter movements. In other places in the world, a place where we have also seen forgiveness as central to these politics is in South Africa. Nelson Mandela and Desmond Tutu crafted the Commission on Truth and Reconciliation as necessary to bring the possibility of healing to the tremendous hurt and harm wreaked by White Supremacist Racism in their nation. As preparation for this Sunday's sermon and Gospel Talk, I'd like to simply pass along an amazing diagram from Tutu's book on forgiveness. Please join us this Sunday, as we are also launching Sunday School for our children. Remember, we are learning and talking about God's politics for their sakes – that our children have a chance to grow up in a world marked more by healing and wholeness.


HOLY HYGGE A New Season! - Welcome All - New and Old

Hygge [HYOO-guh] has become a cultural buzzword. When many read about this Danish practice, their shoulders lift in excitement, then fall in exhale. In a culture of rush, hygge appeals to their desire for rest—for slow living, shared moments, and fostered friendships. Hygge has strong ties to beauty, contentment, and well-being. It's warm and inviting. Hygge is the opposite of hustle. It eschews abundance. It savors. It takes things slow and envelopes you in sanctuary. Hygge is home. When you sit in a comfy chair by the fire, that's hygge. When you arrange a fresh bouquet of wildflowers on a bedside table, that's hygge too. Candles, soft furnishings, natural light, fresh-baked pastries, intimate gatherings with friends—these are what come to mind when you think of hygge. But hygge can be so



In Holy Hygge, author Jamie Erickson unites the popular Danish practice with the deep, theological truths of the gospel. She unpacks the seven tenets of hygge: hospitality, relationships, well-being, atmosphere, comfort, contentment, and rest. In addition, Erickson shows how the external veneer of a lifestyle can create a life-giving home only when placed under the hope of the gospel. Holy Hygge provides practical ideas for using hygge to gather people and introduce them to faith in Christ.
