
HOLY HYGGE A New Season! - Welcome All - New and Old

Hygge [HYOO-guh] has become a cultural buzzword. When many read about this Danish practice, their shoulders lift in excitement, then fall in exhale. In a culture of rush, hygge appeals to their desire for rest—for slow living, shared moments, and fostered friendships. Hygge has strong ties to beauty, contentment, and well-being. It's warm and inviting. Hygge is the opposite of hustle. It eschews abundance. It savors. It takes things slow and envelopes you in sanctuary. Hygge is home. When you sit in a comfy chair by the fire, that's hygge. When you arrange a fresh bouquet of wildflowers on a bedside table, that's hygge too. Candles, soft furnishings, natural light, fresh-baked pastries, intimate gatherings with friends—these are what come to mind when you think of hygge. But hygge can be so



In *Holy Hygge*, author Jamie Erickson unites the popular Danish practice with the deep, theological truths of the gospel. She unpacks the seven tenets of *hygge*: hospitality, relationships, well-being, atmosphere, comfort, contentment, and rest. In addition, Erickson shows how the external veneer of a lifestyle can create a life-giving home only when placed under the hope of the gospel. *Holy Hygge* provides practical ideas for using *hygge* to gather people and introduce them to faith in Christ.

Sunday's Worship: Season of Creation

For the next two weeks, we will experience something new to us at LCR: the "Season of Creation." Globally, this has been a 'thing' in the church for more than 30 years, generally observed from September 1 through October 4 (St. Francis's birthday). The first papal encyclical that Pope Francis issued in 2015 was Laudato Si': On Care for Our Common Home. In Racine, the Laudato Si movement was launched at Siena Center several years ago, and they are hosting our first ecumenical Season of Creation prayer service tomorrow at 9am, beginning outside on the grounds overlooking Lake Michigan. I am honored to have been asked to preach at this service. Our sister church United Lutheran has observed the Season of Creation for four Sundays every September-October for going on ten years now. On Sunday, we at LCR join the movement with "Earth Sunday" – and next Sunday with "Climate Sunday."

Why does observing the "Season of Creation" matter? Our Christian Bible begins with not one but two creation stories (Genesis 1:1—2:4a and Genesis 2:4b-25). The foundation of Judeo-Christian faith is a Creator God who made the world "very good," and so sent Jesus to begin the project of saving it. And in both stories, human beings are given the job of caring for the creation. So when sin intervenes in Genesis 3, it's crucial that we see that what's messed up is our stewardship of creation. Our most basic failure has been to not care for our earth home as we were created to do. When we typically talk about stewardship in the Fall, we should begin with the most grievous failure of our sin: God in Jesus Christ is calling us back to our most basic calling, namely, to care for the earth and for one another. This year, we do so by observing the Season of Creation before our more traditional stewardship emphasis next month.

The Season of Creation in the church also coincides globally with the increasing crisis of climate change which faces all of humanity. Thus far among our politicians and global leaders, there has been a general failure to significantly or adequately address this looming crisis. Even worse, many of our leaders have chosen to be "climate deniers." Who is going to help lead us out of this mess if we followers of Jesus do not answer the fundamental call of our Bible's central calling to care for God's good creation?

This is a number one issue for our children and grandchildren, if not yet for us. When will we begin to signal to them that it is becoming important to us, too? These next two Sundays of celebrating the Season of Creation can begin to answer their concern. Please join us!
