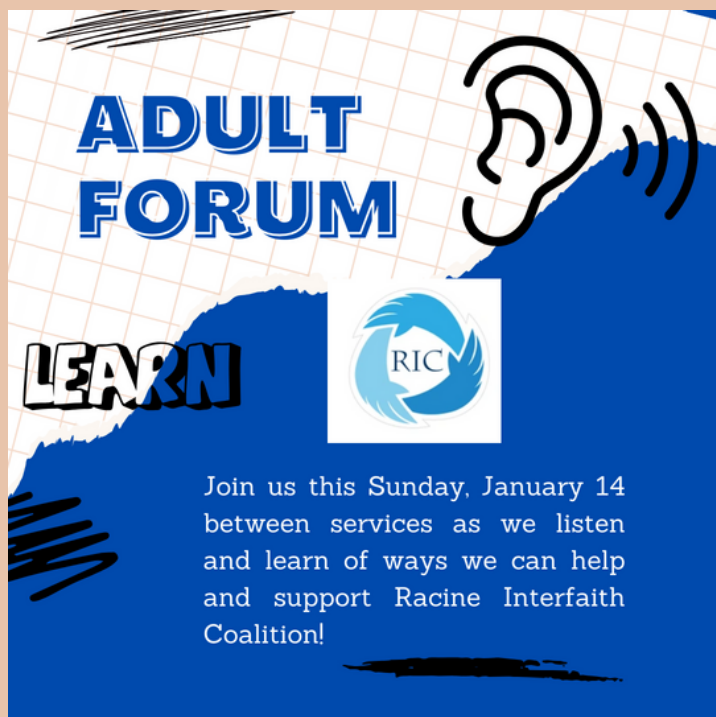

On Sunday January 14th we will be joined in Worship (at both services) by Ri' Witer from the Racine Interfaith Coalition (RIC)!

RIC is a Racine nonprofit organization made up of 27 congregations or affiliates who are united in our belief in the inherent value of every individual and our shared obligation to create a fairer, more equitable, and more just community. The issues we tackle, and the projects we undertake, are driven by our vision and mission, our faith traditions, the commitment of our volunteers, and the statewide programs of the faith-based organization with which we are affiliated (WISDOM)

From 1993 to 1995, RIC's main thrust was to expand the organization by enlisting other faith communities, RIC grew from ten member communities at the end of 1994 to 15 by the end of 1996. RIC was established in 1993 as a response to members of local religious organizations who sought social justice for all sectors of the Racine community, but especially for those without wealth and power.

Their mission is to inspire and mobilize faith-based congregations to address issues of economic and social injustice through education, advocacy and community organizing.

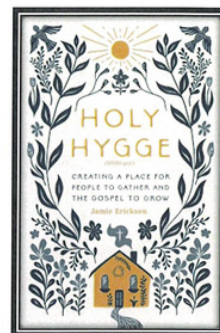
Discussion of Chapter 4 - ATMOSPHERE

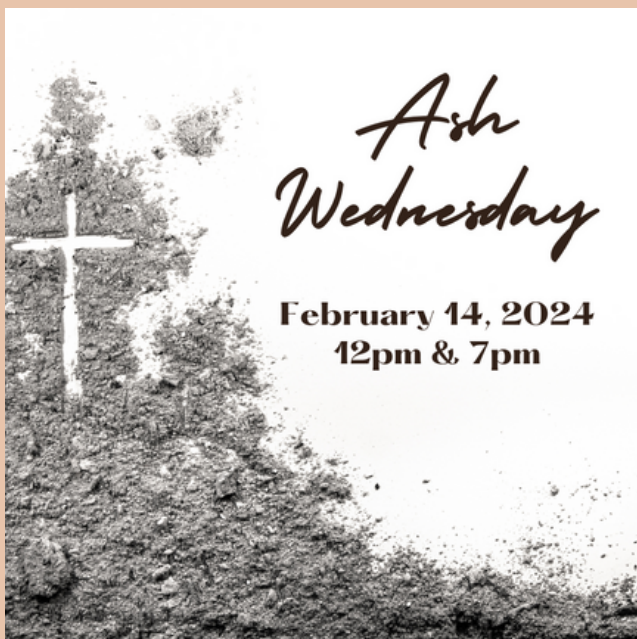

LENTEN SERVICES

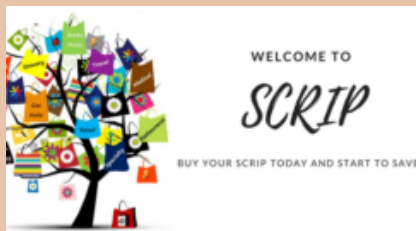
